NSAID Treatment of Canine Corneal Ulcers

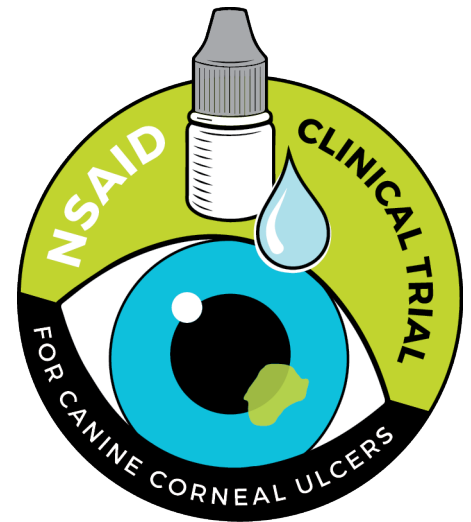


TREATMENT RECOMMENDATIONS & TRIAL REQUIREMENTS

We appreciate your interest in enrolling your pet or pet patient in our NSAID clinical trial. Your participation is important. It will help us determine if we can provide more comfort for pet patients during corneal ulcer treatment without sacrificing the rate of healing.

We'll be conducting the trial from Mar 2021 to Mar 2022. Your pet or pet patient will be involved in the study until the ulcer has fully healed—anywhere from a few days to a few months, based on the type of ulcer.

It's important that the trial candidate has been diagnosed with a corneal ulcer and has just begun treatment with one of the following required therapies associated with their diagnosis.



SUPERFICIAL, UNCOMPLICATED ULCERS:

Neomycin/Polymixin B Sulfates/Bacitracin Zinc ophthalmic ointment three times daily and gabapentin at 10mg/kg PO B-TID

INDOLENT ULCERS:

Ofloxacin ophthalmic suspension 4 times daily and gabapentin at 10mg/kg PO B-TID

**Diamond burr debridement and contact lens placement to be performed by Animal Vision Center of Virginia upon referral*

STROMAL ULCERS:

Ofloxacin ophthalmic suspension 4 times daily, Cefazolin 5% 4 times daily, and gabapentin at 10mg/kg PO B-TID
